Ann White has been helping children, parents, educators and health professionals better understand and support human reactions to grief and loss for over 20 years. Presently she is employed at The Healing Center of Seattle as the Children's Program Director. Before moving to Seattle she worked at Hospice and Palliative Care of Greensboro in their Kids Path Program, which she co-founded. During her career in Greensboro, Ms. White developed children's bereavement groups in the schools, a nationally recognized puppet presentation for elementary students, and camps for bereaved children. She also maintains a private counseling practice where she works with loss issues other than those resulting from illness and death.

Beverly Goldsmith is the current Coordinator of the Safe Crossings Children's Grief Support Program of Providence Hospice of Seattle. Beverly received her Masters Degree in Social Work from the University of South Carolina in 1982. Beverly also currently provides clinical supervision and guidance to three Safe Crossings counselors, and is the coordinator of Camp Erin, a weekend children's bereavement camp for kids and teens.
